Such aircraft were restricted to low speeds and low altitudes because of the drag on their wings. The passengers usually sat in wicker chairs that weren't bolted to the floor, and the journey could be bumpy when flying through turbulence. Warm clothing, and ear plugs to reduce the effects of prolonged noise, were required. During the 1930s, powerful, streamlined, all metal monoplanes became widespread. By 1939, the advent of pressurized cabins allowed fast flights at high altitudes, where there is less turbulence. Flying boats were still necessary on many routes until 1945 because of inadequate runways and the frequency of emergency sea landings. The Second World War, however, resulted in enough good runways being built for land-planes to become standard on all major airline routes.
