= penetrate

The firefighters <u>broke through</u> the thin wall easily.

ortaya çıkmak, belirmek = appear

Blinding sunlight broke through the clouds.

 - The thieves have <u>broken</u> in through a window.

 interrupt
 - Please listen to me. You can't just <u>break</u> in like that!

- 7. break up sona ermek = end
 - Jeremy's parents <u>broke up</u> the party at midnight.

ilişkiyi sonlandırmak, ayrılmak

= end relationship

We thought she would <u>break up</u> with him soon.

parçalara ayrılmak, parçalamak = separate, disintegrate

 We <u>broke</u> the chocolate bar <u>up</u> into smaller pieces.

- 8. break down bozulmak = stop working
 - I hope my computer doesn't <u>break down</u> these days.

kendini kaybetmek

= lose control of emotions

 Ralph worked so much that he finally <u>broke</u> down.

= separate

 Heat <u>breaks</u> the substance <u>down</u> into chlorine and a few different types of gases.

ortadan kaldırmak, yıkmak

= remove

They broke down the house with a bulldozer.
