2. **back up** desteklemek
= support
 - All of them will **back** you **up** at the election.
 - I will **back** you **up** when you need me. Don't worry.
3. **blow up** patlamak, patlatmak
= explode, make something explode
 - The bomb **blew up** as the children tried to move it.
şişirmek
= inflate
 - She hasn't got enough breath to **blow up** the balloons.
4. **break out** başlamak
= start
 - She was 13 years old when the war **broke out**.
kaçmak
= escape
 - You aren't brave enough to **break out** of prison.
5. **break through** yarıp geçmek
= penetrate
 - The firefighters **broke through** the thin wall easily.
ortaya çıkmak, belirmek
= appear
 - Blinding sunlight **broke through** the clouds.

6. **break** in bir yere zorla girmek
= intrude
 - The thieves have **broken** in through a window.
sözünü kesmek, lafa karışmak
= interrupt
 - Please listen to me. You can't just **break** in like that!
7. **break up** sona ermek
= end
 - Jeremy's parents **broke up** the party at midnight.
ilişkiyi sonlandırmak, ayrılmak
= end relationship
 - We thought she would **break up** with him soon.
parçalara ayrılmak, parçalamak
= separate, disintegrate
 - We **broke** the chocolate bar **up** into smaller pieces.
8. **break down** bozulmak = stop working
 - I hope my computer doesn't **break down** these days.
kendini kaybetmek
= lose control of emotions
 - Ralph worked so much that he finally **broke down**.
bölmek, parçalara ayırmak
= separate
 - Heat **breaks** the substance **down** into chlorine and a few different types of gases.
ortadan kaldırmak, yıkmak
= remove
 - They **broke down** the house with a bulldozer.

- 9. break into** zorla içeri girmek
= intrude, breach
- I wouldn't **break into** that fenced-off land if I were you.
 - In the UK a house is **broken into** every two minutes.

- 10. bring about** olmak, yol açmak
= cause to happen
- All my efforts **brought about** nothing at all.
 - Voting in elections is the best way to **bring about** political change.

- 11. bring out** üretmek = produce
- The company **brings out** just two kinds of products.

= cancel
